West Midlands News

- Staffordshire-based building services firm Birchall, has won a £1 million contract to fit out a 5,000-seater sports stadium in Glasgow for the 2014 Commonwealth Games. The venue is receiving a £14 million upgrade to host the rugby, track and field events. Birchall has been commissioned to provide mechanical services including heating systems, domestic water services, automatic controls and ventilation for two new stands.

- Birmingham has been chosen to host the 2012 UCI BMX World Championships, the sport's last major competition before the London Olympics. Birmingham was awarded the competition thanks to its central location, strong infrastructure and first class sport facilities, said officials from cycling's world governing body who reached the decision at a meeting in Lausanne. They beat rival bids from Copenhagen, Auckland and Rotterdam
- Balkan gypsies, bhangra dancers, and football referees will bring the streets of Coventry to life in a series of Olympic-themed theatre shows in the city centre on July 25. Play the Streets will be the first of three events to mark the beginning of the Coventry's summer events programme, which will celebrate the wealth of creative talent in the city.
- Nearly 300 delegates from 31 countries travelled to Coventry to participate in Play the Game 2009, the sixth world conference on sport and society, which was supported by Advantage West Midlands. Journalists, researchers, administrators and other sports stakeholders shared experiences and ideas for the future development of sport and its role in society.
- The Welsh Rugby Union has unveiled a synthetic replica of the famous Millennium stadium pitch thanks to West Midlands-based TigerTurf (UK) Ltd. TigerTurf, who are the chosen surface for all RFU funded projects in England, have installed the state of the art "Total Rugby" surface, at the WRU training headquarters - Vale Resort Complex near Hensol in Wales.
- Organisers of this year's Birmingham Half Marathon have revealed plans for a faster, flatter course. This year's event will now start and finish in the city centre and will be predominantly flat and straight on roads which are closed to traffic. The event, which takes place on Sunday, October 11, looks set to attract some of the world's top athletes as the IAAF World Half Marathon Championships will be held just an hour before the main race.
- The £32 million redevelopment of Warwickshire County Cricket Club's Edgbaston ground has passed its final hurdle after the government decided not to order a public inquiry into the controversial scheme. Building work is expected to start before the end of the cricket season, with the new-look stadium ready to stage Test matches in 2012.
- Olympic and Paralympic athletes from the past and present will get special training to help them promote the region's role during the 2012 Olympics. They have been invited to a special presentation at Coventry Transport Museum, which will include a

presentation from the region's lead ambassador David Moorcroft on how they can help bring the magic of the London Games to the area.

- Loughborough University and the Japanese Olympic Committee (JOC) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding that will see both organisations working together until the London 2012 Games. Fifteen Japanese sports, including Athletics, Hockey, Triathlon and Basketball, will use Loughborough University and selected facilities in the region between now and 2012.
- The first architect's images of Birmingham new £58 million Olympic standard swimming pool, water park and leisure centre, have been released. Council leisure bosses have opened an exhibition of the plans at the neighbouring Nelson Primary School, allowing the local community and wider public to have their say before the proposals are confirmed.
- A delegation of visitors from Birmingham's twin city Chicago have visited the city for a four-day fact-finding exercise, to identify examples of best practice in regeneration in areas challenged by deteriorating housing stock. Visitors from America's Urban Institute toured a number of areas funded by housing regeneration agency Urban Living and others, which covers 60,000 homes in Birmingham and Sandwell

London 2012 News

- Hertfordshire has joined the growing list of counties and cities across Britain to sign up a team to train in its area before the London 2012 Olympics, it has been announced. A deal has been signed with the British Virgin Islands to train in the county.
- Olympic bosses are reportedly preparing to scrap the decision to reduce the 80,000-seater Olympic stadium to a 25,000-capacity athletics venue after the 2012 Games. The newly appointed Olympic legacy team has reportedly decided against scaling back the £547m stadium as it wants to ensure a bigger sporting legacy after 2012. The new team is thought to want the stadium to remain a major sports-themed attraction and retain capacity to put on big events, including staging 2018 World Cup matches if England's bid to host the tournament is successful.
- Take 137,000 festival-goers, seven interactive web developers, the expertise of the London 2012 Live Sites programme and the BBC Big Screens team, add a large dollop of Cultural Olympiad video content from all over the UK and what have you got? Camp Pilton – Glastonbury's latest invention, based at the historic Glastonbury

'Meeting Point' in the heart of the festival site. Richard Crowe, the Creative Programmer for the South West brought together video artists from across the UK through his Nations & Regions colleagues. They were joined by teams of digital developers together with BBC Big Screen producers who worked with the crowds to build live interactive artwork.

- The £355 million International Broadcast Centre (IBC) and Main Press Centre (MPC) for London 2012 is on track after plans were approved by the Olympic Park Planning Committee. Currently under construction by Wolverhampton-based Carillion, the IBC/MPC will be home to 20,000 broadcasters, photographers and journalists during the London 2012 Olympics.
- London 2012 has completed a deal to sell almost half of the housing units in the £1 billion Olympic Village after the Games. The agreement with Triathlon Homes will allow the ODA to sell 1,379 out of 2,800 homes in the East London development. Triathlon Homes is a joint venture between urban development company First Base and two local housing associations, East Thames Group and Southern Housing Group. The investment includes a £110 million grant from the Homes and Communities Agency (HCA), equity from Triathlon Homes, and lending from the European Investment Bank and Barclays Commercial Finance.
- LOCOG has announced its plans to roll out the London 2012 Inspire programme across the whole of the UK. Inspire is opening up the opportunity for millions of people to become part of London 2012 and help deliver a sporting and cultural legacy. More than 175 non-commercial projects, over 100 of which are now part of The Cultural Olympiad, have already been recognised through the Inspire programme and carry the sought-after Inspire Mark. LOCOG estimates that ten million people will participate in the scheme by 2012.
- LOCOG has started the search for a further sixteen volunteers to join Trailblazers, the pre-Games volunteer programme based at the London 2012 offices in Canary Wharf. The successful recruits to Trailblazers will work for one day a week across the teams at LOCOG. There are a broad range of roles for people to contribute to the work of the Marketing, Communications, Transport, Venues, Health, Legal, and Human Resource departments. Roles range from an Olympic Park Tour Volunteer to a Legal Team Assistant Volunteer.
- London 2012 has taken a step closer to preparing for Games-time operations by publishing information outlining plans for temporary controls to street trading and advertising in 2012. The temporary regulations, under the London Olympic Games

and Paralympic Games Act (2006), will be focused on the period two weeks before the start of the Games until five days after the closing ceremony of the Paralympic Games. They are aimed at allowing the majority of businesses to continue operating as usual while also ensuring that the Games are not impacted by over-commercialisation or ambush marketing.

- Applications for UK Sport's second 'Ideas4Innovation: New Researchers' award have now closed. Ideas4Innovation (I4I) is an award scheme developed by UK Sport's Research and Innovation team designed to harness the creativity and expertise of the British public to find novel performance solutions for British athletes. The New Researchers Award is aimed at final year undergraduate or masters students, who are invited to submit their final year project, and the Garage Innovators Award is aimed at any sporting enthusiast with a fantastic idea to improve elite performance.
- London 2012 is now offering free bus tours of the Olympic Site. The tours run on Tuesday / Wednesday / Friday evenings at 6 pm, and on Saturdays and Sundays with four tours per day. You can book up to 12 weeks in advance by contacting the booking line on 0300 2012 001.
- Some 200 small firms across East London have come face-to-face with the big 2012 Olympics contractors, to grab a slice of the £6 billion cake. Contractors building the one-and-a-half square mile Olympic park just south of Hackney Wick need hundreds of sub contractors and service providers. So they met suppliers from the five host boroughs including Hackney and neighbouring Tower Hamlets, Newham and Waltham Forest at a 'meet the buyers' event staged at Leyton Orient football club.

Other Major Sports Projects

- Built to look like a vast cooking pot simmering above a ring of fire, South Africa's Soccer City Stadium promises to be an unforgettable venue for next year's World Cup and one of the world's most spectacular sporting arenas. Costing 3 billion rand (227 million pounds) the 94,000-capacity stadium is distinctive, resembling a huge calabash -- a hollowed-out gourd used as a cooking pot or water carrier throughout Africa. The calabash has inspired the colouring of the orange and brown membrane that surrounds the stadium while a ring of lights will illuminate the bottom of the building, simulating fire underneath the pot.

- Glasgow council has named the winning bidder to build the £245m athletes' village for the 2014 Commonwealth Games. The City Legacy consortium will build accommodation for 6,500 athletes and officials for the 2014 Commonwealth Games. The buildings will be converted after the games to make 1,400 homes for sale and rent. Glasgow council will make the site for the village available to City Legacy at "nil cost" in order to avoid the problems faced by the 2012 Olympics athletes' village developers Lend Lease in raising private finance. Instead, the development consortium will enter into a profit-sharing agreement with the council when the homes go to the market.
- Vancouver 2010 organisers have admitted that the economic slowdown is proving to be a major hurdle in the race to sign up needed suppliers for next year's Winter Olympics. As well as making it difficult to line up sponsors, the recession has also made it difficult for some companies to bid on supply contracts for jobs such as providing food at local venues.
- US President Barack Obama has announced the formation of the White House Office of Olympic, Paralympic and Youth Sport. This permanent White House office will promote the values of the Olympic Movement and encourage increased youth participation in athletics. The primary function of the Office will be to enhance awareness of the Olympic Movement through promotion of its fundamental principles at the federal level.
- The Football Association, which is bidding to host the 2018 FIFA World Cup, will have to choose 11 out of 15 cities which have applied to hold World Cup games. Bristol is bidding to become a host city, playing up its geographic location as the only other city outside London bidding to host games south of Birmingham. Leicester is also bidding to stage matches at the Walkers Stadium. The club would need to expand the stadium to a capacity of 40,000 to meet FIFA requirements and plans have already been drawn up. Sheffield United has also announced plans to redevelop Bramall Lane and increase capacity to 44,000 in time for the 2018 World Cup
- Organisers of the 2010 Commonwealth Games have admitted that increased construction costs will force them to go up to eight per cent over the planned \$1.6 billion (£1.1 billion) budget and there will be some delays completing the facilities. Measures are reportedly in place to contain costs and ensure completion of venues in times for the Games, which are scheduled from October 3-14, 2010.

- Moscow has been confirmed as the host of the first European Olympic Youth Trials for athletics in May 2010. European Athletics, the Russian Athletics Federation and city of Moscow authorities have come to an agreement for the Russian capital to be the venue for the qualification tournament for the inaugural Youth Olympic Games in Singapore in August 2010.
- Britain and fellow Olympic host nation Russia have signed a deal to set up a working relationship which develops economic and sustainability legacies from the 2012 and 2014 Games. Britain has already signed Host2Host agreements with Singapore and Vancouver, hosts of the 2010 Youth Olympic Games and 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games respectively.
- 13 bids have been put forward for the 2018 and 2022 World Cups. For both Cups, FIFA have registered bids from Australia, Belgium/Holland, England, Indonesia, Japan, Mexico, Russia, Spain/Portugal and the United States, while South Korea and Qatar submitted bids exclusively for 2022.
- FIFA has announced the 12 host cities for the 2014 World Cup in Brazil. There were no real surprises as Belo Horizonte, Brasilia, Cuiaba, Curitiba, Fortaleza, Manaus, Natal, Porto Alegre, Recife, Rio de Janeiro, Salvador and Sao Paulo were given the go-ahead to stage games in the tournament. Rio de Janeiro has also presented its proposal to be the official base for FIFA and the Media Center, and to host the World Cup Final itself at the Maracanã

Sponsor Activity

- GE, a worldwide partner of the Olympic Games, has announced plans to donate £4.8 million (\$8 million) worth of medical equipment, including foetal monitors, incubators and MR scanner, to Homerton University Hospital in Hackney, East London. Hackney is one of the five Host Boroughs of the London 2012 Games. The hospital is the nearest to the Olympic Park. The donation is part of a GE Healthcare programme 'healthymagination', using innovative technology to improve healthcare around the world.
- Nike and USA Track & Field (USATF) have signed a \$10 million (£6 million) extension of their 18-year sponsorship deal for another four years beyond the London 2012 Olympics. Nike has been a sponsor since 1991 of the USATF national team. The company outfits all USTF teams in international competitions, including

the Olympics. Nike are also to establish a "Project 30 Fund" to aid up-and-coming athletes.

- LOCOG has announced that The Nielsen Company has become its 10th Tier Three provider and 20th domestic commercial sponsor overall. Nielsen becomes Official Market Research Services provider to London 2012. Working in collaboration with the London 2012 marketing team, The Nielsen Company will undertake all of LOCOG's market research services requirements, including developing a market research strategy, undertaking tracking studies and organising online panels and surveys.
- Olympic champion Victoria Pendleton is swapping cycling Lycra for recycled haute couture in a bid to encourage people to live more sustainable lives in a new scheme called Team Green Britain ([click here](#)), set up by London 2012 sponsor EDF Energy. The design by Wayne Hemmingway is based on a green Union Flag and made entirely from recycled materials. Pendleton, who won the sprint at the Olympics in Beijing last year, will wear the creation on the first Green Britain Day, organised by EDF Energy to inspire Britons to cut the UK's carbon footprint in time for the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.
- As part of the build-up to the 2010 FIFA World Cup, FIFA's global partner Coca-Cola, has launched the FIFA World Cup Trophy Tour, which will visit 87 cities in 84 countries from September. Meanwhile Adidas expects soccer sales to exceed 1.3 billion euros (£1.1 billion) next year as fans purchase jerseys, balls and footwear tied to the 2010 World Cup.
- The inaugural Super 8 event in Cardiff was marred after Kelly Sotherton, Hannah England and Greg Rutherford were withdrawn over a sponsorship row. The trio are sponsored by Nike, who wanted their athletes to wear branded kit, but the Super 8 vest carries just the event logo and team name. UK Athletics said it hoped to resolve the sponsorship issue before the next event, expected to take place next year.
- To help deliver a carbon neutral Games, Vancouver 2010 is partnering with Offsetters, a leading BC-based carbon asset management company and supplier of high-quality carbon offsets. Offsetters will receive sponsorship rights in the carbon offsets Official Supplier category for the 2010 Winter Games and for the Canadian Olympic Team competing at the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Winter Games and the London 2012 Olympic Games
- Rio de Janeiro's bid to host the 2016 Olympic and Paralympic Games has gained the support of another major Brazilian company. The Odebrecht conglomerate has

decided to embrace the Rio 2016 bid by becoming its latest sponsor. Odebrecht has already supported the Brazilian Olympic Committee in the past, notably in the run up to the Rio de Janeiro Pan American Games in 2007.

- LOCOG has announced Holiday Inn and Holiday Inn Express as the 'Official Hotel Services Provider to London 2012' and a Tier Three commercial partner. Holiday Inn, part of InterContinental Hotels Group (IHG), will provide LOCOG with additional capability and expertise in the accommodation sector, supplying experienced personnel to assist in the planning and operation of the Olympic Village.

Collateral Projects

- The first phase of Barking Riverside – the largest single housing development in the Thames Gateway, has won planning permission. The project will provide 3,300 homes, two schools and associated infrastructure as part of the £3.5 billion, 11,000-home development in east London, being built over 25 years.
- Hackney Marshes, Europe's largest expanse of playing fields and the spiritual home of Sunday football, is getting a £10 million makeover. Details are being finalised on a funding package to restore grass pitches, lay all-weather playing areas, improve parking and build a futuristic two-storey clubhouse as a centrepiece of the site's regeneration. A new pedestrian bridge will improve access to the Marshes by linking them to the Olympic Park in the east. Work on the five-year project will begin this year and is intended to boost the popularity of the playing fields, already used by about 1,500 players every Sunday.
- More than 18,000 Londoners have tried out different sports through a coaching programme designed to get more people active in the run up to the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games. The London Development Agency's (LDA) Summer of Sport and Winter of Sport programmes will this year be part of the Mayor of London's Play Sport London initiative
- Sheffield Council has unveiled its plan which aims to ensure people in the city reap the benefits of the 2012 Olympic Games. The main points of the plan include getting people to be more physically active, helping local sportsmen to succeed and securing more major sporting events for the city in the run-up to the Games.
